Notes

It is necessary that the following information should be shown on plans, which accompany the completed planning application form. For planning permission in principle, the minimum information required is:

Site plans showing:

- the boundary of the site, and its general location to scale of 1:10 000
- the location within the site of any trees, buildings, walls, fences, etc.
- the proposed means of access to the site
- the proposed vehicular route to the access point from the nearest road (A or B classification)

For planning permission in detail, this **additional** information is necessary:

Site plans showing the location of any screening, washing equipment or other plant and settlement ponds to 1:500 scale.

Location plan showing:

- the sources of water used for washing etc., and the point where any discharge is to be made to 1:10 000 scale (an additional application to SEPA may also be required)
- the phasing of extraction, showing the direction of working, and reinstatement of the site
- the areas for the storage of overburden
- a contour survey of the site with contours at a minimum of 1 metre vertical interval
- cross-sections through the site showing the existing ground level, the depth of the proposed workings and the proposed ground level after the reinstatement of the site
- the location and details of any buildings to be built

Planning and Sustainable Development may occasionally require further information to that requested on the application form and that listed above, according to any special circumstances which may exist in relation to a particular site.

Automatic Conditions

1. Planning consent is normally granted for a specific number of years.
2. On expiry of the consent or on the completion of the extraction (whichever is the sooner) all plant and machinery has to be removed from the site and the site restored to agricultural or other agreed use within 6 months thereafter.
3. Prior to any working of the site a phased programme of extraction and restoration has to be agreed with Planning and Sustainable Development.
4. The mineral workings have to be fenced to the satisfaction of the City Council.

Optional Conditions

5. No trees to be removed without the prior consent of the City Council.
6. No extension to take place within 15 metres of a public road (or within a specified distance from mature trees, electricity pylons, railway lines, water courses etc.)
7. The workings to be screened by specified mounding and trees of agreed types.
8. Access to the site to be constructed to the satisfaction of the City Council with a minimum of 6.3 metres over the first 20 metres from the public road, radii to be not less than 10.5 metres and be constructed in heavy duty tarmac.
9. Mineral extraction (inc. Drilling, blasting, crushing or screening) shall not be permitted on Sundays and between 6.00pm and 8.00am during weekdays.
