


Evaluation Report

Background

To celebrate both the 125th anniversary of the Central Library building and the Scottish Year of History, Heritage and Archaeology in 2017, Aberdeen City Libraries hosted the first Local History Conference in the City.



Held on Saturday 4 March 2017 in the Beach Ballroom, the main aim of the conference was to inform delegates of the inherent bias to be found in all forms of historical research and delivery – hence the title "Hall of Mirrors".

The programme reinforced this message and sought to deliver a broad range of speakers on topics which may not have been familiar to those who had attended similar events in the City previously.

As part of the conference, we also held a Local Heritage Fair on the day. The fair was open to the general public as well as conference delegates and sought to showcase the wide range of organisations involved in local history in Aberdeen.
