Getting the property we are in now felt a real struggle to "beat" the others in the race. We managed to transfer the money via phone before another viewee who was doing the same thing at the same time; the difference must have only been 10 seconds because she was giving her card details the same time as us. We were lucky, but what about the other 4 couples on the viewing (and others) who had to continue the race with ever limiting availability. I believe the University of Aberdeen has 13,000 students (including

part-timers). I don't know what the amount is at Robert Gordon University but that means there needs to be a drastic increase in Landlord's and those willing to rent out properties. I graduate this year and I am most likely going to have to move back in with my parents in England as there simply is not the option of properties to rent here in Aberdeen affordably. My current job on full-time hours would only bring in around £600 (gross) a month. My half of the rent is £400, with bills around £500 per month. This would not leave me enough money to buy food each week and get the bus to work. So I will most likely have to sacrifice my part-time job (which I enjoy) to move back in with my parents and be unemployed in another part of the UK. Unfortunately this is how things are just now, but it feels a shame as I would like to stay in Aberdeen. Maybe when the economy and housing picks up I will be able to return.
