The proposed site is not suitable as it is far to small (reference the number of caravans recently pitched-up behind Lidls on King Street & in Seaton Park). There are no footpaths or street lights on Scotstown Road so pedestrain access would be extremely dangerous, access to/from the propsed site for long vehicles (i.e. car & caravan) would be dangerous. Building costs would be very high. The propsed site is too close to the settled community and sites designed to protect the natural environment, and the site would be particularly dangerous for travelling children.
