

Integrated Impact Assessment Pre-screening

The Biodiversity Duty Report summarises what actions the Council has taken over the 3-year reporting period to protect and further biodiversity in our area. At a local level Aberdeen City Council (ACC) has enhanced biodiversity through actions including: managing invasive non-native species, integrating multifunctional green infrastructure (e.g. sedum roofs and solar panels on bus shelters), our countryside and park rangers deliver biodiversity messaging to the wider public and education service, all schools in the city have an eco-group or climate change committee and they make positive changes to the natural environment.

ACC also works to connect vulnerable people with nature, make allotments a prime place for biodiversity and important stepping stones within habitat networks in the urban environment and the Council remains a key partner in the North East Biodiversity Partnership (NESBiP), which tackles threats to biodiversity and facilitates conservation action for local biodiversity, and in the North East Scotland Biological Records Centre (NESBReC) who collect, store, manage and disseminate biological data for various organisations including local authorities.
