Delivery of additional affordable homes across the city. The provision of additional affordable homes has no negative impacts. This an update report so no new activities have been implemented.

Work is ongoing to deliver larger family homes through the affordable housing supply programme which will provide a positive impact for those from ethnic minority groups who have larger families and require to live in larger family homes. Whilst there is the intention to deliver this, it must be coupled with budget pressures as the cost of delivering larger homes is significantly higher and does not attract as much grant subsidy in comparison to smaller homes, so delivery will be challenging.

Work is ongoing to deliver more fully wheelchair accessible homes through the affordable housing supply programme which will provide a positive impact for older people and/or those living with a disability.
