What do you think should be our main planning priorities for the City Centre?:

The City centre should be a busy commercial hub with a variety of shopping opportunities. There are currently too many betting shops/mobile phone shops and charity shops...bring back big names and mix with local small businesses promoting the north east economy. A cafe culture would be useful with outdoor seating. Weekly farmers and continental markets in the Belmont Street and Castlegate areas. Increasing tourism by investment in air routes, cruise visits and attractions (open top city tours, walking tours of city centre/old aberdeen/footdee and torry etc) Advertise Theatre, museums and art galleries beyond the city nationally and internationally. WELCOME tourists. - festivals and events (NUART was great). Do SOMETHING with Union Terrace Gardens - it has potential to be a great public space.

Attract central investment rather than out of centre retail malls and centres. Attracting investment and tourism will generate wealth for the city.

New builds should be sympathetic to the surroundings and re-furbishment should embrace heritage.

Reduce costs for businesses in any way poss ble. Ensure safety of employees travelling to or at work. Ensure roads infrastructure is capable of dealing with new business traffic flows for ease of travel to and from and with minimum impact on existing residents/businesses.

Increase council owned housing stock for rent. Owning "affordable housing" is still outwith the reach of the majority of young families. Short term low rent housing may allow saving for eventual purchase.

What do you think should be our main planning priorities for supporting retail centres across Aberdeen?:

Support existing retail spaces. There are empty units in all of our centres. Get them filled before building or providing further facility, There is an over-provision of office space and hotel beds yet these continue to be built/converted. No more building until current stock is fully utilised.

What do you think should be our main planning priorities for protecting and enhancing the natural environment and preventing flooding?:

No more erosion of the green space. This plan identifies the conversion of swathes of green space for residential development. Parks and green spaces across the city should be maintained. Nature waks and trails should be refurbished and advertised. Outdoor sports facilities should be encouraged/provided.
